

# Plastic Breath Guards Care and Use Instructions



## HOW TO CLEAN PLEXIGLAS<sup>®</sup> AND ACRYLIC:

- Always use a clean soft lint free cloth or micro fiber cloths along with a cleaning solution or products specifically made for cleaning Plexiglas<sup>®</sup> and acrylic plastic.
- Clean Plexiglas and acrylic with a neutral cleaner such as a solution of warm water and a small amount of dish detergent.
- Recommended cleaners for Plexiglas<sup>®</sup> and acrylic include: Novus<sup>®</sup> #1, Plexiclear, and Brillianize.

## WHAT NOT TO DO:

- **Do not** use cleaners containing ammonia, alcohol, acetone or dry cleaning products. Cleaners with these chemicals will damage Plexiglas<sup>®</sup>, acrylic and other plastics.
- **Do not** use paper towels, abrasive materials, scratching cleansers, razor blades, brushes, steel wool or scouring pads, such as Scotch Brite<sup>®</sup> pads.
- **Do not** use WD-40<sup>®</sup> or petroleum, industrial or commercial cleaning products.

## REMOVING MINOR SCRATCHES:

- Fine scratches can be removed with a specialized mild abrasive polish such as Novus<sup>®</sup> #2, or Novus<sup>®</sup> #3. Heavier scratches, such that you can feel with your fingernail, will require some elbow effort to remove with a bit of sanding and buffing. A series of grits (250, 400, 600) followed by a buffing wheel and available buffing compound, will restore the luster of your Plexiglas<sup>®</sup> or acrylic.
