



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## LAUNDRY TIPS

Protection	Washing	Drying	Drying	Drying
 <p>Always use a pillow protector, duvet cover, or feather bed protector to extend the life of the product and the time between washings</p>	 <p>Spot clean when possible, launder when necessary and/or required by brand standards (e.g. Once per quarter on blankets). See “spot cleaning tips” below.</p>	 <p>Do not overfill the machines. Follow the <b>“10 and 2” rule</b>. When you are drying or washing bedding, the products should be falling from either the 10 o'clock position or the 2 o'clock position as you look at the front of the machine. If the products are just spinning in place then there is a good chance that the machine is overfilled!</p>	 <p>Tennis balls added into the dryer can help to speed up the drying process by fluffing the products and moving the fill around</p>	 <p>Be sure that all products are thoroughly dry (both at the corners and in the center of the product) before storing. Incomplete drying can lead to product failure.</p>

<p>Baby food, milk, mucus, blood, cheese sauce, mud, cream or pudding, egg, urine, feces, vomit, white glue, ice cream.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Remove excess matter first</li> <li>2. Apply a detergent or spot remover that contains enzymes (For detergents, use only with cold water. Warm or hot water will set the protein stain.)</li> <li>3. Blot with a white cloth</li> <li>4. Launder with the enzyme detergent if the stain is stubborn</li> </ol>	<p>Alcoholic beverages, berries, coffee, cologne, felt tip water colored pen or washable ink, fruit juice, soft drinks, tea, tomato juice.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Apply a detergent or spot remover that contains enzymes</li> <li>2. Do not use soaps (bar or flake). Soaps set the stain.</li> <li>3. Launder the product immediately if possible.</li> </ol>	<p>Hair oils, bacon fat, hand and face lotions, butter/margarine, lard, mayonnaise, salad dressings, cooking fats and oils.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Apply detergent or stain spray to the stain and work it in</li> <li>2. Blot stain with a white cloth</li> <li>3. Suntan products are best removed by pre-treating the stains with a heavy liquid detergent, aerosol petroleum based solvent pre-treatment spray, or a pump-type detergent-based pre-treatment spray.</li> <li>4. If the stain persists, wash the product as recommended and repeat</li> </ol>	<p>Cherry and blueberry, felt pens, grass, Kool Aid, mustard and tempera paint.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Pre-treat the stain with Ecolab® Stain Blaster</li> <li>2. For stubborn stains, soak in a dilution of all-fabric powdered bleach (The drawback to using bleach is that it removes color and weakens threads in the fabric).</li> <li>3. Launder as recommended</li> </ol>

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
